o Follow Up on Discussion from the i3 Working Group

- Several Board members met with the NENA i3 Core Services Working Group last week to review the proposal to extend the root certificate validity period from 3 to 10 years
- Some concerns voiced, but the Core Services Providers were in support of the extended 10-year validity period
- Mr. O'Conor shared that two individuals shared that 5-years may be more advisable, but those individuals ultimately did not object to a 10 year validity period

Access to the Forest Guide is provided on an annual basis. The first year of access includes an initial one-time setup fee and an annual subscription fee based on population served by the NG9-1-1 Interoperability Services subscriber. In subsequent years, subscribers only pay the annual subscription fee.

The Forest Guide subscription fees represent wholesale pricing from Intrado. The NIOC does not add any additional fees on top of the wholesale pricing; it is passed through as-is to subscribers.

The NIOC is the independent oversight governance body for the NG9-1-1 Public Key Infrastructure (PKI), Forest Guide, and other technical-interoperability services necessary for interoperability and security in NG9-1-1.

Appendix A

Agency	A Public Safety Entity that is eligible to hold an Agency Certificate. After the RA has Authenticated the Agency, the Agency may then designate an Agency Representative to act on its behalf
Agency Certificate	An End-Entity Certificate issued to an Agency.
Agent Certificate	An End-Entity Certificate issued to a person.

CA (Certification Authority)	The CA is the collection of hardware, software, and operating personnel that create, sign, and issue Public Key Certificates to Subscribers.
CPS (Certificate Practice Statement)	A statement of the practices which a CA employs in issuing Certificates
Discrete ICA	An ICA operated by the Subscriber or a third-party PKI service provider on behalf of the Subscriber.
Element Certificate	A Certificate issued to a physical or virtual entity that is addressable and has a unique ID.
End Entity Certificate	A Certificate issued to a physical or virtual entity that is addressable and has a unique ID.
Hosted ICA	An ICA that is hosted by DigiCert in its PKI facilities.
HSM (Hardware Security Module)	A physical computing device that safeguards and manages digital keys for strong Authentication and provides crypto processing.
ICA (Intermediate CA)	A CA subordinate to the PCA or another ICA and operates in accordance to the CP.
ICA PA – Tier 2 and beyond	A PA assigned by the ICA owner to be responsible for setting up and approving policies and practices that apply to their ICA. The authority for the ICA PA is defined the ICA's CPS
MA (Management Authority)	The PA oversees the MA to provide trust management services to support the NG9-1-1 ecosystem in meeting its security goals in using the PCA PKI.
PA (Policy Authority)	The body established to oversee the creation and update of Certificate Policies, review CPSs, review the results of CA Audits for policy compliance, evaluate non-domain policies for acceptance within the domain, and generally oversee and manage the PKI Certificate Policies
RA (Registration Authority)	The RA is an authority that performs Certificate Management functions on behalf of the CA, such as collection and verification of a Prospective Subscriber's identity and information that is to be entered into the Subscriber's Public Key Certificates.
Relying Parties	A Relying Party is an entity that relies on the validity of the Binding of the Subscriber's name to a Public Key. The Relying Party uses a Subscriber's Certificate to verify or establish the identity and status of the Subscriber.
Service Certificate	An End-Entity Certificate issued to a service.

Subscribers	A Subscriber is the entity whose name appears as the Subject in

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Proposed NIOC Bylaw Changes

Section 2 Nomination and Selection

Subsection 2: Selection

The following items were added for clarity:

- E. After the Board's vote, all nominees will be notified in writing of the Board's decision. Notice may be sent by the Chair of the Commission or the NIOC Program Manager.
- F. All newly elected and re-elected Commission members will be administered the Oath of Office at the Commission's next regular meeting, or at the Commission's earliest convenience.

Section 3: Tenure and Succession

Subsection 1: Tenure

The following language was added to facilitate the nomination process:

Commissioners who wish to seek another term shall provide written notice and supporting documentation to the NIOC Program Manager by the last day of February. If notice is not received by the last day or February, the Commissioner(s) will not be presented to the Board for consideration for a subsequent term.

Subsection 2: Departure from the Commission

Letter C has been modified to provide clarity for the removal of a Commissioner.

A commissioner may be removed at any time. The reason for removal must be documented in writing and notice provided to the affected individual. A vote will be taken at the Commission's next regularly scheduled meeting, or by a special meeting called by the Chair or by any six members of the Commission. The commissioner will be removed upon a 2/3 vote of Commission's standing members not including the commissioner proposed for removal. In the event the Commission cannot achieve a 2/3 vote, the matter will be presented to the Board for consideration. The Board will vote and the commissioner will be removed upon a 2/3 vote.

Article 7: Officers:

Language Modifications for all Officer positions on the Commissions, allowing selfnominations.

Any voting member in good standing may nominate a candidate, including his or her self for any post for which they qualify.

Section 5: Election and Terms of Office

B. has been modified to remove term limits for Officers of the Commission. This is only for Officers, and all other term limits remain in effect.

Each Officer of the Commission shall serve a term of one (1) full year. Officers of the Commission may serve unlimited consecutive terms, at the discretion of the Voting Members of the Commission.

Article 13: Conflict of Interest Policy**

Section 1: Policy

Added B, C, and D to this section as follows:

- 1. At the first meeting of a Commission meeting held following a change to this policy, the Chair shall read a summary of all changes to this policy.
- 2. Whenever practical, when the Commission meets electronically, meeting attendees shall be compelled to electronically confirm that they are familiar with this policy and agree to abide by it prior to being accepted into the meeting.
 - C. At meetings of the Commission, the Chair shall ask whether anyone present has not received or does not agree to this conflict of interest policy, and, after offering any person responding in the affirmative an opportunity to withdraw from the meeting. The minutes shall record the fact that the question was asked, along with the name and affiliation of any person responding in the affirmative
